
OVERVIEW

A provider's enrollment must be denied or closed if the department is made aware that they or an adult household member, age 18 and over, has certain pending criminal charges or has been convicted of any of the terminable crimes listed in the crime codes exhibit, unless an administrative review of the crime(s) determines he/she is eligible; see BEM 704, Administrative Review Process.

Only the following pending charges will prevent the provider's enrollment or close the provider:

- Homicide
- Kidnapping
- Sexual Assault
- Assault Excluding Sexual
- Dangerous Drugs
- Sex Offense Excluding Assault and Commercializing
- Weapons Offense

The crime code headings derive from offenses identified in the Good Moral Character Rule, R400.1152. Each crime category contains a crime code and title originating from the Prosecuting Attorneys Coordinating Council (PACC) and the Michigan Compiled Laws (MCL).

If the conviction was outside of Michigan, the charge may have a different code than those listed in the crime codes exhibit. Deny or close the enrollment if the general description and/or conviction title is listed.

CRIME CODES

Crime codes can be accessed from the DHS Net:

Enter the crime code in the Find box to search the exhibit. Be sure to include the decimal point in the code. For example: 333.74012B-A.
