ADDRESS REPORT**

Report APF-201 reports the results of Federal Parent Locator Service location searches. Responses from federal agencies are compiled and generally provided on one report about 6-7 weeks after the State PLS receives the search request. Results of State Employment Security Agency (SESA) searches are reported separately since SESA matches are run quarterly. A sample PLS report is provided below:

DESCRIPTION**

<u>Item</u>	<u>Description</u>
User ID	Local requestor identification or State PLS identification
SSN	The social security number of the payer as identified by the requestor
Date	The date the report was printed
Case ID	The DSS, IV-D or court case number as identified by the requestor
Case Type	A letter code identifying the type of case. Codes and case types are as follows:

	<p>A - ADC-IV-D</p> <p>N - Non ADC IV-D Full Service</p> <p>L - Non ADC IV-D Locate Only</p> <p>P - Parental Kidnapping or Child Custody</p>
User Code	An alpha-numeric code which identifies the local agency and the county of the requestor and may identify the district office or individual requestor number within a county. For example, S63 means the requestor is a support specialist in Oakland County.
Local Code	The Julian date from 001 through 365 which identifies the date the Federal PLS request tape was created from standard search requests
Name	The absent parent's name (last, first, middle initial) as submitted to the Federal PLS
Returned Name	The name, if any, returned by the federal agency queried. In some instances, the name returned will not match, either completely or partially, the name submitted to the Federal PLS. For example, the National Personnel Records Center matches records based solely on SSN. Other agencies match records based on SSN and the first four letters of last names. Requestors should compare the report to existing records to resolve any discrepancy.
Address Field	<p>The address returned by the federal agency/source queried. (See Appendix 4 for State and country abbreviations that may appear in addresses.) The types of address returned are:</p> <p>Department of Defense - Duty station or military unit address for individual on active duty; residence or mailing address used to mail benefit checks and correspondence to retired individual.</p> <p>Internal Revenue Service - Residence or mailing address from the tax return</p> <p>Master Beneficiary Record, Social Security Administration - Residence or mailing address used to mail social security benefit checks</p> <p>National Personnel Records Center - Personnel office address of current or former federal government employee</p> <p>Selective Services System - Residence or mailing address from draft registration under the Military Selective Service Act</p> <p>Social Security Administration employer file - Employer address from W-2</p> <p>State Employment Security Agency responding state - Employer address from quarterly wage report filed by employer with their SESA;</p>

residence or mailing address used for mailing of unemployment compensation benefits

Veterans Administration - Residence or mailing address used for mailing of VA compensation, pension or educational benefit or other correspondence

Messages	One or more messages may be provided by the responding federal agency/source to indicate the reason an address is not provided, to identify benefit or employment status or to report referral of the case to another agency. See Exhibit 3 for an explanation of messages
Source	Abbreviations which identify the federal agency or source providing the response. Agency/sources are as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> DOD = Department of Defense IRS = Internal Revenue Service MBR = SSA Master Beneficiary Record NPRC = National Personnel Records Center SSA = Social Security Administration SSS = Selective Service System SESA XX = State Employment Security Agency responding state. State abbreviations are identified in Appendix A VA = Veterans Administration
Date of Address	When provided, this field identifies the date of the federal agency record. This field is used as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> IRS - December of the tax year (12/YY) for which the federal tax return was filed SSA - Year (19YY) for which W-2 was filed SSS - Date (MM/DD/YY) of the draft registration SESA - Quarter and Year (QR/YY) for which the quarterly wage report was filed with the responding state's State Employment Security Agency NPRC - Date NPRC loaded reported address on their system
Corp. Division	An alpha or numeric code used by the Social Security Administration to identify a division of a major corporation

Control

When the last name of the taxpayer in the Internal Revenue Service file does not agree with the payer's last name, IRS will give the name from their files if 3 out of the first 4 letters of the last name do match. If the names are totally different, IRS will not report the name.
