COMPLIANCE WITH LAW AND POLICY

The PAFC contractor shall comply with all applicable federal and state laws and all applicable provisions in the consent decree entered in Dwayne B. V. Granholm, 2:06cv-13548. Many of these laws are outlined in the PAFC contract and FOM 721, Legal Requirements. The PAFC contractor shall ensure that the DHS Children's Foster Care Manual (FOM) is provided either in hard copy form or electronically to the contractor's social service staff. The PAFC contractor shall ensure that social service staff are aware of the policies and procedures contained in the manual, interim policy bulletins and L-Letters, which are submitted to the contract Compliance Unit. Compliance with these policies and procedures is required.

Note: The current version of FOM is available online at www.michigan.gov/dhs-manuals under the Children's Foster Care category. The interim policy bulletins are also contained under the same category.

Foster Care Supervision

Foster care supervision is a program that provides a comprehensive and coordinated set of activities designed to place and supervise children in out-of-home placement.

Foster care supervision includes:

- The provision of services as outlined in the FOM and PAFC contract.
- Referrals for services to enhance child and family functioning and to ameliorate the conditions that caused the child's removal from parental custody.
- Developing and implementing a treatment plan and service agreement to facilitate one of the five federal permanency planning goals:
 - •• Reunification.
 - •• Adoption.
 - •• Guardianship.
 - •• Placement with a fit and willing relative.
 - •• Another planned permanent living arrangement.
